
Dear Valued Client,

Residential Electronics Recycling



What is eWaste?

When you retire your used electronics, they become eWaste (electronic waste). If these electronics are burned or landfilled, the toxic and hazardous substances in them can be released, threatening the environment and human health. Electronic waste also contains valuable resources that can be recovered when recycled properly.

What Can I Recycle?

We accept any old, unused or broken items from the following categories (*No Appliances Accepted*):

- Computers
- Laptops
- TVs (CRT & Flat Screen)
- Printers
- Monitors (CRT & Flat Panel)
- DVD/DVR/VCR Player
- Fax Machines/Scanners
- Gaming Consoles
- Audio Equipment
- Telephones
- Cell Phones
- Cameras/Camcorders
- CD/DVDs and Cases
- GPS/Navigation Systems
- iPod/MP3 Players
- Remote Controls/Gaming Peripherals
- Computer Peripherals Keyboards, Mice, Wire)
- Misc electronics

What Happens to my eWaste?

After you drop off your eWaste to be recycled, it is sent to the recycling facility at MPC where all of the electronics are sorted and separated. If your equipment is able to be reused, all data is completely wiped before preparation for reuse opportunities. Equipment that is no longer able to be used will be recycled. During the recycling process, the electronics are sorted and shredded. Precious metals are recovered and all other material is recycled. MPC has a 100% No-Landfill policy, so you can be sure that all of your eWaste is being recycled responsibly.

MPC adheres to the highest standards with R2, ISO 9001, ISO 14001 certifications, BAN e-Stewards and NAID membership. You can be confident that any data on your electronic equipment will be securely wiped and your equipment will be responsibly recycled.
