Village Approves Economic Development Project

On February 8th, the Lindenhurst Village Board approved plans for a major economic development project. The Zeigler Auto Group, which operates over 20 auto dealerships in the midwest, is planning to build a Nissan dealership at the southwest corner of Routes 45 and 132.

In March 2015, the Village approved the annexation of a number of properties to accommodate the auto dealership project in Lindenhurst. The Village's Plan Commission, a citizen volunteer commission that reviews development projects for compliance with Village code and planning goals, reviewed the detailed plans and recommended approval.

Construction on the new business is slated to begin in 2016, with an opening scheduled for 2017. The business will create 70 to 80 new jobs, and will generate positive taxes to area taxing districts.

The Village's annual Earth Day festivities are an opportunity for residents to learn about environmental preservation and sustainability in a fun, family-oriented atmosphere.

Join community members at 10:00 a.m. to visit with various vendors, play bingo, participate in kids' activities, and enjoy refreshments held in the Village Public Works garage. There is lots to do, including the Park District's *Flying for Kids* annual kite fly at Slove Park. Attendees can take a tour of the Police Department and Water Treatment Plant, as well as talk to members of the Environmental Commission. Recycling opportunities will be available for clothing and textiles, shoes, hangers, and a plastic bag exchange.

Linden Notes

Landscape Collection Starts in April

Spring is just around the corner and so is the start of landscape waste collection with the Village's contracted waste hauler, Groot. Landscape service begins April 4 and runs through November 28. Landscape waste includes grass, shrubbery, small tree limbs and weeds. Sticker service: Each sticker is \$3.15 and one must be affixed to each 32-gallon container or Kraft bag placed curbside each week. There is no limit to the number of containers that may be placed curbside with sticker service. Subscription service: This service is \$140 annually. Residents may place up to four 32-gallon containers or Kraft style bags curbside each week; any additional containers would require a sticker. Stickers can be purchased at the following locations: Groot's website (www.groot.com), at Walgreen's (399 S. Rte. 45), or Butera Finer Foods (1500 W. Grand Avenue). Tree Replacement Program

The Village offers a program to assist

residents who wish to plant a tree. Under this 50/50 tree replacement program, the Village will reimburse residents who wish to purchase a new tree for their property or parkway area. The program parameters are as follows:

- Residents will be reimbursed 50% of the cost of a single, acceptable tree, excluding sales tax, delivery, installation, etc. up to \$200.
- Program dollars would be dispersed by the Village to the homeowner after the purchase and planting of a new tree.
- Households could participate once per year.
- Residents can submit a receipt to Village Hall for reimbursement.
- First come, first serve basis as budgeted funds are available.
- A list of acceptable trees is available on the Village website.

Shoreline Stabilization Program

The Village offers a lake shore stabilization program for residents who own lake shore property. Through this program, the Village will reimburse residents who plant acceptable shrubs and plantings that help to preserve the shoreline and water quality of the lakes. The list of acceptable plantings is taken

from the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency. This list is also located at www.lindenhurstlakes.com. Other guidelines include the following:

- First come, first serve basis as budgeted funds are available.
- Eligible residents may be reimbursed 50% of their expenditure up to \$100.
- Residents must submit a receipt to Village Hall that itemizes the acceptable purchase.
- A list of acceptable plantings is available on the Village website www.lindenhurstil.org.

Utility Bill Payment Options

Residents can take advantage of the Village's on-line utility bill system, at no additional cost. Residents can use the My Utility Account to pay their utility bill, view the bill or receive paperless billing through the e-bill program. CONSTRUCTION UPDATE

Lake Michigan Water System Improvements

- Areas currently on private wells will see the installation of a water main: Lindenhurst Drive, Old Elm Road, Woodlane Drive, Thornwood Drive (Sand Lake Road to Beck Road), Briar Lane, Countryside Lane to Burr Oak Lane, Ridgeland Drive, and Fairfield Road.
- Installation of large diameter pipe to connect the Village's two water towers will continue in 2016. Impacted areas: Laurel Drive, Witchwood Lane to Rolling Ridge, Rolling Ridge (Witchwood Lane to Sprucewood Lane), Sprucewood Lane (Rolling Ridge Lane to Hickory Drive), Hickory Drive to Hazelwood Drive, Hickory Court, North Beck Road (Grass Lake Road to north of Great Oak Drive), and High Point Drive (High Point Drive south from Beck Road).

Beck Road Improvements

Starting in March, construction of water main improvements in the northern section of Beck Road will begin. Weather permitting, this work is anticipated to be completed in June. Immediately after the water main work is complete, the reconstruction of Beck Road will begin. This process will involve the complete reconstruction of the northern section of Beck Road (Grass Lake Road to Spring Hill Lane), the resurfacing of the southern section (Spring Hill Lane to Sand Lake Road), and drainage improvements, curb repair and sidewalk installation throughout the project area.

Fairfield Storm Water Improvements

As part of the water main project, the Village will be taking steps to reduce street flooding on Fairfield Road.

Answer: 70 - 80 new jobs, and taxes to area taxing districts.

Pet Vaccination and Microchip Clinic

The Lake County Health Department/Community Health Center's Animal Care and Control program, in conjunction with the Village of Lindenhurst, will offer a low-cost pet vaccination and microchip clinic on Saturday, May 14th. The event will be held at the Public Works Garage, 2301 E. Sand Lake Road, from 9:00 a.m. to Noon.

All animals brought to the clinic should be at least four months old. In addition, dogs must be leashed and cats placed in carriers. Cash payment only is required at the time of vaccination. For pets that are spayed/neutered, a one-year rabies vaccination and Lake County tag are \$20; a one-year rabies vaccination, Lake County tag and distemper are \$25. For pets that are not spayed/neutered, the one-year rabies and Lake County tag are \$60; a one-year rabies tag and distemper are \$65. A distemper vaccination only is \$10, and a microchip only is \$15.
