Lindenhurst Grand Avenue – Trees Rededicated

Lindenhurst, Illinois – On Monday, April 22, 10:00 a.m., the Village of Lindenhurst will be relocating two trees that will be impacted by the Grand Avenue improvement project underway in front of the Lindenhurst Police Department. Trees are one of the treasured features of our Village. “These valuable amenities also provide symbolic meaning to former servants of our community,” said Mayor Dominic Marturano.

In another example of our residents making a difference, Robert Holbach of Milburn Tree Farm originally donated these trees to honor Officer Edward Miller and former Police Chief Jack McKeever. Bob has once again volunteered his services for their relocation. Since Lindenhurst has been recognized as a Tree City USA for over 20-years, Earth Day just seemed to be the appropriate time to rededicate these trees and our commitment to a green environment.

The Village is still planting replacement parkway trees that required removal due to the Emerald Ash Borer.
